Dear Past Pupil.

I hope that you have had a summer full of sunshine and rest. I know that you are all eagerly awaiting your results on Friday. Here are the details of how the next few days will work.

Your Leaving Cert results will issue through the **Candidate Self Service Examination Portal**, which you used throughout your Leaving Cert year. There is a change of password option on the portal in case you have forgotten your details.

Unfortunately, students may not collect results in school: this is a Covid measure. Please do not come to the school without an appointment on Friday.

On Friday, **3rd September, 10 am**, the portal will be open for you to look at your results. You will be given the BEST result you achieved in a subject, between your Accredited Grade and your Written Paper. On this day, the 3rd September, information about WHICH grade has been allocated will not be available. All we will know is that you will have been given your higher grade.

On Tuesday, 7th September, you (and the school) will be able to see BOTH sets of results, but your 3rd September result stands.

Viewing Scripts 2021

Following receipt of your Leaving Cert results, you may wish to view the script of your written paper. There is no fee to view scripts.

You may also wish to appeal a result. There is no fee this year to appeal a result.

Viewing Scripts.

If you wish to view your WRITTEN PAPER SCRIPT, you will apply to do so yourself, through the Candidate Self Service Portal. The portal will be open for this purpose from **5pm on Tuesday, 7th September until 8pm on Wednesday 8th September.**

NB. THIS YEAR, YOU WILL HAVE TO MOVE VERY FAST IF YOU WANT TO VIEW YOUR SCRIPT.

You will be assigned a time on Saturday 11th to come to the school to view scripts which have been marked by hand.

For scripts marked online, you will view these through the Candidate Portal from 9am on Saturday 11th September from 9am. (Online marking took place in LCVP, in HL and OL Maths, Biology, Chemistry and Physics AND in HL English, History and Geography.)

Appeals.

If you wish to appeal either your Accredited Grade or your Written Exam Result (or both, where this applies), you must apply through the Candidate Self Service Portal. **This will open at 9am on September 11 for this purpose. The portal will close at 12pm on Monday 13 September.**

The results of Appeals will be issued on a date to be confirmed.

Appealing a Written Paper: Your original paper will be sent to a new examiner and will be re-marked. Practical / coursework MAY be revisited in the school also.

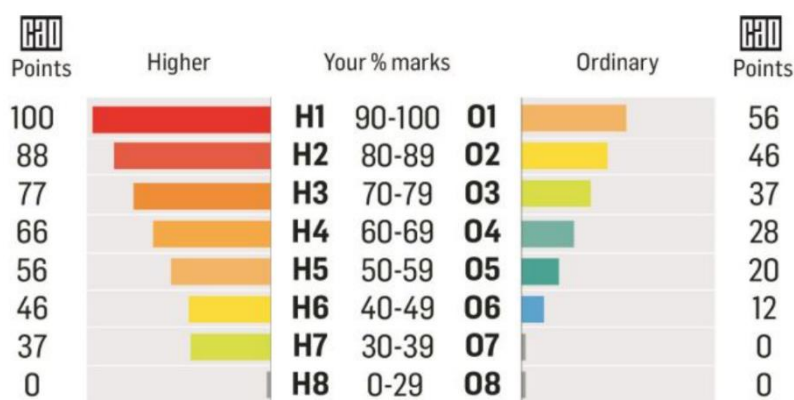
Appealing an Accredited Grade: Please note that the process of appeal of an Accredited Grade excludes the professional judgement of the school in providing an estimated mark to the SEC and the standardisation process. The details of the standardisation process has not been provided to schools. These aspects of the AG are NOT open to appeal. The appeals process concentrates on checking that forms were completed correctly by the school, that data was transferred correctly and that the transmission of data occurred correctly.

Remember, this is how to calculate your points.

1. Write down all your results and the matching points (see image below to calculate your points. Be careful to take the points from the correct column, Higher or Ordinary.) You will have between 6 and 8 subjects.
2. Add 25 points to your points for HL Maths, if you have a H6 or better.
3. Tick off your top 6 points (not your top grades)
4. Add up your top 6 points.
